Dear Congregants,

Congregation Emanuel of the Hudson Valley will be reopening the synagogue building for in-person services. All services will also be Livestreamed so that everyone can participate at their comfort level.

The health, safety and welfare of all of our congregants remains of paramount importance. We believe that in-person services provide important continuity for our community as well as meeting important religious, spiritual and faith needs of our members.

As we navigate the challenges of covid and the recent surge of infections due to the omicron variant we will be observing the following protocols:

*All attendees (2 and older) will be required to remain masked and socially distanced while inside the building. During the covid surge there will be a minimum of 15 feet between pods. HEPA filters will be in continual use in the main sanctuary.

*All those who are attending in-person services, and *are eligible* to be vaccinated, are required to be fully vaccinated (full vaccination includes the booster) according to eligibility. Please be prepared to show your proof of vaccination upon entering the building.

*All attendees will be required to sign in at each service for purposes of contact tracing.

*During this period of the covid surge there will be no eating or drinking in the building.

*During this period of the covid surge all congregants are asked to refrain from social gathering in the building following services..

*If you are not feeling well, have experienced any covid symptoms, or have had a covid exposure please refrain from coming to in-person services and join us virtually via Livestream.

We are in need of volunteers to serve as greeters (ushers) for Sabbath services. Please contact the main office if you are willing to volunteer to greet on a Friday night or Saturday morning.

Thank you for doing your part in sustaining our wonderful community and keeping one another safe.
